## Welcome and Thank You

#### Dear Altar Server

Thank you for volunteering to become an Altar Server in our parish.

An Altar Server's role is to help the priest at Mass and other services. We also help the other people in church – the congregation, join in the service. As such, we are subject to DBS Enhanced Checks as part of the Diocese's safeguarding requirements.

People take their cues from the Altar Servers for what they should be doing, including: standing, sitting, kneeling, saying the prayers; so, it is important that we know the rubrics of the Mass. There is a saying, that a good Altar Server is 'invisible', this means when things go right, no one should not notice us. We only become 'visible' if things go wrong, which we should try to avoid.

It is important that we stay safe while serving, especially when moving around church wearing your Cassock (and Cotta). Position your cassock, so you do not step on it when rising from a kneeling position. Manage the risks associated with candles, oil, and the thurible (which can get hot), appropriately.

There are a number of roles to do. Some people prefer doing certain roles and not others, but we ask that you try each one – servers should be interchangeable. There are a few jobs, that we might only let the more experienced Altar Servers do, such as Thurifer. Some Altar Servers are also instituted as Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers, so may have an additional role to undertake, on some Sundays.

We aim to have a team of four as a minimum, and up to seven (preferred) or more, to ensure that all the roles can be performed and that the duties do not need to be shared. If you are unable to undertake you assigned role on any given Sunday, then please let the Master of Ceremonies (MC) know, as far in advance, as possible.

You should always check with the MC or an experienced server, to confirm the role that you will be undertaking. If you ever need help, ask the MC, Deacon or Priest. Don't worry about making mistakes, we've all made them! But do try not to repeat the same mistakes, too often.

Always try and arrive in good time, at least 20 minutes before the start of a service (preferably 30 minutes). This gives you time to get changed and organised. You should make sure that you are in the correct attire: white shirt (with collar), black trousers, and black shoes. You should then put on your cassock. Your cotta should be put on immediately before the prayers before Mass; and removed immediately after prayers after Mass, in the Sacristy.

We really appreciate you joining the Altar Server Team; and for undertaking this important role! Thank you.

### **Preface and Eucharistic Prayer**

The choice of Preface and Eucharistic Prayer is, on some days, dictated by the Missal rubrics or the local Ordo. On all other occasions the celebrant will select the most appropriate combination.

- Sundays outside Advent and Lent
- On Solemnities and Feasts
- Celebrations of a solemn character
- As directed by the Missal rubrics.

### Readings

- Sundays and solemnities have Sundays two (2) readings
- Weekdays typically have one (1) reading
- Sequences after the 2nd reading occur on Easter Sunday and Pentecost.

- Sundays
- Days ranking as Solemnities
- As directed by the Missal rubrics.

### Intercessions

- Other occasions as directed by the celebrant.
